History and architecture and cobbled streets. Castles and beaches. Serene waterways and cosmopolitan cities. The world capital of chocolate. Some 500 varieties of beer. Mussels in white wine, and bakeries galore. Flemish and French and everyone's friendly. This is Belgium, and we're going to visit the best of it.





We'll be sailing from Nieuwpoort to Gent, via Leper and Bruges, but we won't be on sailboats- we'll be chartering modern 42- to 48-foot canal boats. And anyone can skipper these simple boats down the shallow, narrow waterways (no sea sickness!), as no license or experience is required. With 4 cabins, dual steering stations, galley and salon, and lots of sundeck space for watching everything go by, these are the ideal boats for our week afloat.

We'll meet in Brussels, where our private bus will take us out to the base in Nieuwpoort (Newport), and we'll board our waiting boats. Famous for the overwhelming fresh seafood market, vibrant nightlife, and beaches, this is a great place to start our Belgian adventure.

We'll be sailing a total of about 45 miles during our week aboard, crossing 8 locks and ducking 18 bridges, so we'll have plenty of time for exploring ashore. We may stop in Oudenbourg for some sightseeing, or visit Oostende, with its famous fishing community, beaches, museums, and Napoleon's stronghold.

As we cruise past the splendid castles that line the banks of the river Leie, we'll make a mustsee stop in Bruges, where the medieval town center has been designated a UNESCO World Heritage Site. There are also some fifty

Other possibilities include the gothic churches of Diksmuide, the "Hall aux draps" in Leper, the Pavilion of Spanish Officers and the gardens of Sainte-Walburge in Veurne, or the Straffe Hendrik Brewery tour. We'll end our cruise in Gent, the pearl of Flanders, which was once the largest city in Europe after Paris. No other city in Belgium has as many monuments and important buildings, and the historic center is ideal for exploring on foot.



Some of the great masterpieces of old Flemish paintings are housed at the St. Bavon cathedral. We'll next board our private bus back to Brussels, where we'll enjoy 3 nights in a luxury hotel, allowing plenty of time to relax and explore and enjoy everything this wonderful city has to offer.


